Charles John Huffman Dickens

started his writing career as a political journalist. He is the author of 22 novels, many of which were written in serial form for several magazines. He also wrote short stories and poetry. He was a crusader against poverty and slavery.

There are several museums in his honour and from 1991-2003 he appeared on the Bank of England's £10 note.

Dickens was born in Portsmouth, but spent most of his life in Kent and London. He and his wife Catherine married in 1879 and had 10 children. He is buried in *Poet's Corner* in Westminster Abbey, London.
